

United States Cases: 1/1/2011 – 3/31/2017

INTRODUCTION

The Transportation Industry intersects with human trafficking in the United States in a number of different ways. A number of these intersections are reflected in the reports of human trafficking made to the National Human Trafficking Hotline. This report includes information about the calls and cases reported to have intersections with taxis and other commercial driving services; buses and bus stations; and airlines and airports.

This is not a comprehensive report on the scale or scope of the intersection of the transportation industry and human trafficking in the United States. It represents only cases reported to the National Hotline from January 1, 2011 to March 31, 2017.

TAXIS AND COMMERCIAL DRIVING SERVICES

The following information is based only on cases which referenced intersections with taxis or other commercial driving services. Intersections are broadly categorized and include, but are not limited to, situations where commercial driving services were used as a means of controlling or transporting potential victims; cases where potential victims utilized these services as a means of escaping their trafficking; and cases where commercial driving companies or drivers were complicit or actively involved in the trafficking situation.

The National Human Trafficking Hotline received reports of **118 cases of human trafficking** which referenced intersections with taxis or other commercial driving services from January 1, 2011 to March 31, 2017. Each case represents a situation of trafficking which could include one or multiple potential victims.

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BUSES AND BUS STATIONS

The following information is based only on cases which referenced intersections with buses or bus stations including both city and long distance travel buses. Intersections are broadly categorized and include, but are not limited to, situations where buses or bus stops were locations used by potential traffickers to recruit potential victims; cases where potential victims utilized buses as a means of escaping their trafficking; and cases where buses or bus drivers were used to transport potential victims to and from location of the potential trafficking.

From January 1, 2011 to March 31, 2017 the National Human Trafficking Hotline received reports of 320 cases of human trafficking which referenced intersections with buses or bus stations. Each case represents a situation of trafficking which could include one or multiple potential victims.

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AIRLINES AND AIRPORTS

The following information is based only on cases which referenced intersections with airlines or airports. Intersections are broadly categorized and include, but are not limited to, situations where potential traffickers used air travel to transport potential victims between numerous locations of trafficking and cases where potential victims utilized air travel as a means of entering or escaping their trafficking.

From January 1, 2011 to March 31, 2017 the National Human Trafficking Hotline received reports of 269 cases of human trafficking which referenced intersections with airlines or airports. Each case represents a situation of trafficking which could include one or multiple potential victims.

Assessment are made based on the information reported to the hotline. The National Human Trafficking Hotline is not able to verify the accuracy of reported information.

These statistics are accurate as of September 3, 2017. Situations of trafficking may be ongoing or new information may be revealed to the National Hotline over time so statistics may be subject to change as new information emerges.
